Completely bananas!

Dear friends,

Did you know that bananas seeds are sterile, so each banana we eat is a twin of another banana (essentially similar to cloning) and because of this, some scientists believe that the banana could be doomed. They lack the genes to fight off the pests and diseases that are invading the banana plantations of Central America and the small holdings of Africa and Asia. Whilst there are over a thousand varieties of bananas, the situation is exacerbated because the supermarkets focus on supplying one type of banana, the Cavendish, which is itself threatened by Panama disease amongst others. Why do they do that? In order to make the banana the cheapest fruit in the supermarket.



Did I hear you say, “That’s completely bananas!” But sadly this is just one of countless examples where we have collectively fallen short of God’s plan for us.

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth (Genesis 1:1)... God saw all that he had made, and it was very good (Genesis 1:31)... The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it (Genesis 2:15).

We are to be good stewards of God’s creation not for our own selfish desires but to ensure that all peoples can sustainably enjoy and be nourished by the rich and diverse resources of the earth.

The Bishop of Norwich, Graham Usher, has called for immediate action on climate change, saying:

The message of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change’s Sixth Assessment Report is loud and clear: ‘Wake up world!’ It is time to stop playing political games and take action now. We are already seeing the effects of the climate emergency around the world – and it is the world’s economically poorest people who are already suffering the most. So it is our moral duty, and a Christian calling, to do all we can to try to turn the tide. At COP26 there will be an opportunity to act, our leaders must seize this moment and deliver real and impactful change for the future of God’s creation. We don’t have a spare Earth.

What can we do? Three suggestions:

Reflect on the verses: *The earth is the Lord’s, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it (Psalm 24:1)*

Commit to pray for world leaders that they will be united in meaningful actions and stick to their pledges.

Make changes in our lifestyle that enable us to be kinder to God’s creation.

Dreamland Mission Hospital

What a year 2021 has been, and it's only July! We have very exciting news this quarter. After having our plans approved by the radiation board we broke ground and began building our new X Ray building. Our old X Ray machine is old and often breaks down, it runs on old films which we can no longer get hold of and we only have a limited supply remaining. A newer machine would be much more efficient, reliable and would run on a



digital system. However, our existing building is too small to house these newer larger machines. In early May we broke ground and the building work has progressed quickly from there.

The foundations were soon dug, a concrete slab was laid and the walls rose very quickly. We are now at a stage where we will soon be completing the roof. None of this could have been done without you, our generous donors.



Phoebe - In 2017 Phoebe, who is married and has 7 children, noticed a swelling on her neck. At first she thought nothing of it, that was until she started coughing and it became very tender. A friend of hers who had a similar experience recommended that she visit DMH, when she arrived she was diagnosed with a goitre, a swelling in the thyroid gland causing a lot of discomfort.

She was no longer able to carry anything on her head or undertake any manual labour, both of which are vital for Phoebe's family. Shortly after diagnosis Phoebe had surgery which was a great success. She was able to return to working on her small farm and providing for her family. When she first came to the hospital she was registered onto the National Health Insurance Fund scheme (NHIF), this funded her surgery and now pays for any further medical treatment Phoebe may need. When visited by the follow up team Phoebe said "I am delighted that I will resume my normal life".

Sister Margaret - In May we brought you the sad news that Sister Margaret's husband, Mr Soiter, had sadly passed away. We were so overwhelmed by the response from you, our donors. As a result of your kindness and generosity we were able to ensure that the funeral and other associated costs were completely covered.

Orthopaedic Surgery - Through our ongoing partnership with Project Possible (formerly ROPE) we have been able to conduct numerous corrective surgeries on children who otherwise may never have been able to walk. One of these children is Mary from Masano, Bungoma. Mary is the fourth of five children born to the Nekesa family. She was born with a right clubbed foot, this took her parents by surprise as they had not seen this condition before. Mary and her mum travelled to DMH and after a consultation she was admitted for surgery. The surgery was a success and now Mary is able to walk

run and play with her friends. All of Mary's siblings are in primary school and once her surgery and recovery was complete she was keen to go to school as well. Thanks to sponsorship, Mary will be starting school this term and is looking forward to making friends her age and getting started in education. Mary has been sponsored through education by Project Possible.

7:14 PRAYER MEETING IS 4 YEARS OLD

I was listening to a talk given by the Principal of Cliff College recently about prayer after he had visited KwangLim in South Korea where they have the largest Methodist Church in the world. They started the church in 1971 with 75 members and now have 300,000 members (yes, three hundred thousand!) When asked about this rapid growth, their minister answered with six words; 'No earnest prayer, no church growth'. Their church meets for prayer every single day at 10pm and the building is full with 25,000 members praying until 3am. This routine slightly changes on a Thursday when they meet all night! They are passionate about prayer.

The Principal then commented that he had noticed in our British culture that often, our prayer meetings are often the smallest church meeting and yet we wonder why the Church is in a declining state.

Revival after revival in our country has originally started with people meeting together for prayer.

Four years ago, we started a new prayer meeting at Christ Church called 7:14. We meet on the first Monday of the month at 7:14am. Up to ten of us meet for half an hour and there is a great sense of togetherness, journeying, fellowship and closeness to God. Following lockdown, we have even been able to meet outside for the last few months which has also been inspirational.

Why do we meet at 7:14? 2 Chronicles 7 v14 says 'If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land'.

Meeting first thing in a morning hopefully gives people another opportunity to attend such a meeting, if for example they cannot make our other prayer meeting at 6pm on a Sunday. Yes, it is an early time to get up, but sometimes we have to be prepared to step out in faith and perhaps put ourselves out and the rewards can be mind blowing. God often tells his people that if 'you do this, then I will do this...'

If you haven't been to 7:14, why not try it? Don't worry if you are not comfortable with praying out loud as God will hear your unspoken prayers. Don't worry either if you can't stay for the full half hour, just leave when you need to. The important thing is that we start to meet together and pray together and who knows, it could be the start of a new revival.

We would love to see you. The next meetings are on October 4th and 1st November in the church hall.

CSW AT THE UNITED NATIONS

For a number of years CSW has held consultative status at the United Nations, which allows it to report on cases of religious persecution in the countries where it works. One important way that it maintains contact is through what are called “special rapporteurs.” These are unpaid experts appointed by the Human Rights Council to report on a country or theme. Among them is Dr Ahmed Shaheed, the UN’s Special Rapporteur focusing on freedom of religion or belief. By presenting expert research, including from CSW’s advocates, to the people who hold the power he helps turn CSW’s work into real change.



Throughout their appointment Special Rapporteurs champion human rights around the world by conducting impartial research and by raising individual cases with UN Member States.



Alongside their own fact-finding missions Special Rapporteurs like Dr Shaheed rely on trustworthy accounts from CSW’s own advocates, who gather information directly from people experiencing injustice. The benefits of working with UN experts can be immediate: prisoners could receive better treatment or even be released following pressure from the Human Rights Council. For example, CSW provided Special

Rapporteurs with evidence to confidently call on the Chinese Government to free Pastor Wang Yi, who was detained in December 2018 as part of a large-scale crackdown on unregistered churches. Although this has not yet led to his release, we celebrate the smaller victory that China’s human rights violations were exposed for the world to see. People at CSW take heart that, as more cases are published and publicly condemned in this way, more pressure is put on countries like China to change.

Claire Denman, our Deputy Team Leader for Public Affairs works closely with Dr Shaheed and emphasises the fact that this is a partnership: “Through verified, credible reporting the Special Rapporteurs call out truth to power... They can’t do their work without NGOs like CSW who are reliably providing evidence of human rights violations.”

In November we'll be starting the 'Alpha Youth Series', and offering young people from across the town an opportunity to come together to discuss questions like 'Why am I here?', 'Does life have a meaning?', 'Were we created?' and 'Where do I belong?'.

Questions like this can be vital in helping young people to form their identity, and whilst RE at secondary school is great at giving an overview of what some of the different religions believe, often young people don't really get an opportunity to really explore what they believe within that context. That's one of the reasons why running Alpha with young people is such an exciting opportunity!

We are partnering with Wesley Place Methodist Church to facilitate this course, and both Jonny Newbould (Wesley Place's Youth Leader) and I really believe that it's important that one of the first things we launch now that restrictions have been lifted, is something that will allow young people to explore some of the feelings and questions they've been carrying for the past 18 months. Research has shown that many young people feel like they've not only had the opportunities they would normally have had taken away by the pandemic and national lockdowns, but also much of the control they had over their lives, and the choices they would normally be able to make.

Please join with us in praying that Alpha would provide an opportunity for young people to explore the questions and difficulties that they might've experienced, and hopefully discover or draw closer to their creator through the process.

INGREDIENTS

Vegetable Oil

Seasoning - I used Paprika, Turmeric, Ginger and Crushed Chillies

Chorizo Sausage - a Must unless you go for the vegetarian option

My choice of veg included

1 x Onion

1 x Pepper

¼ of a Cabbage

Choose what you fancy!

Paella Rice (75g per person)

500ml of Stock - Vegetable or Chicken

METHOD

1 Pour your oil into the wok and add your seasoning.

Mix the seasoning until the oil is flavoured.



2 Prep your choices of veg, cube the onion slice the pepper, cabbage, chorizo and prepare the stock



3 Start to heat the oil and add your ingredients

You can either cook the chorizo 1st and then add the veg or cook in batches putting each to one side and add them all together at the end to ensure they are all cooked through.

When all the chorizo and veg is nicely fried, add the stock and Give everything a good stir

4 Now add your Paella rice and stir this in, cover the pan and simmer for approx 30 minutes - check your rice packet for guidelines



5 Serve up and enjoy!

The Friend at Midnight By Canon Paul Hardington

This month we are looking at the Parable of the Friend at Midnight (Luke 11:5-8). It is found in a passage where Jesus is teaching His disciples to pray.

Pray Shamelessly

The parable concerns a man coming to his friend at midnight and asking *'Friend, lend me three loaves, for a friend of mine has arrived on a journey, and I have nothing to set before him'* (5-6). Despite the hour, the rules of hospitality would mean this was not an unreasonable request.

But the friend refuses to help because everyone in his house is asleep. Jesus adds, *'though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, yet because of the man's boldness he will rise and give him whatever he needs'*. Jesus uses this parable to encourage us to come in *shameless boldness* to our heavenly Father with our needs. In contrast to the parable, God is not slow in responding to us. It's not God who is reluctant to answer, but we to ask. Do we pray with shameless boldness?

Pray Persistently

Such confidence is the basis for persistent prayer: *'Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you.'* All three verbs indicate a continual habit: *'Keep on asking...seeking...knocking'*. We will not be content simply to ask once and then move on. Jesus tells us to bring our prayers to God persistently. Do we give up too easily in prayer?

Pray Expectantly:

'For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened.' Do we pray expectantly, believing that God delights in answering your prayers? Why not begin this adventure of prayer today!
