Week 7: Jesus raises Lazarus from death

WELCOME

Spend time relaxing and sharing together.

WORSHIP

Read Psalm 22.1-11

It forms the background to Jesus' cry on the cross, 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?' Psalm 22 lays out the out a prophetic background to the cross and resurrection, which was fulfilled in Jesus.

Perhaps if we are at low point, it helps us to remember that suffering does not have to have the last word. In Jesus, the resurrection and the victory of God have the last word. We can keep in trusting in him.

Spend some time praising God for what he has done for us on the cross.

WORD

Read John 11.1-37

1. Given the close relationship between Jesus and Lazarus' family, why do you think Jesus delayed going to see on hearing the news that Lazarus was sick (vv1-7)?
